Our Salisbury Academy was represented by Year 12 students Kalvyn Karpany and Isaiah Nettle, along with Year 11 student, Wesley Kelly. All three boys contributed significantly to the team and were an absolute pleasure to coach. They represented themselves, their families, the school and the Clontarf Foundation with pride.

Day One saw the four states and territories compete in a round robin. SA got the first win of the day, beating out our rivals from Victoria. WA looked like the early favourites as they accounted for 2023 champions, Northern Territoty. Round 2 saw Victoria take advantage of the NT boys playing back to back games and just like that, the 2023 champs were 0-2. Our boys then got to see how far we had come in 12 months by versing the boys from WA. Unfortunately they managed to get on top and we suffered our first defeat. It was quite a hot afternoon and with a bit of rest, the NT boys got the jump on us as we battled back to back games. We ended the day on 1 win and 2 losses with the final game between Victoria and WA being important for final placings. WA looked a class above as they accounted for Victoria to go undefeated on day one. This left SA, Vic and NT all on one win and two losses for the day, with our boys managing to finish second by percentage!

Day Two saw us take on WA in the Grand Final that was played live on Kayo. Our boys performed extremely well but unfortunately it was the WA lads that took home the chocolates.
